“OVERCOMING CULTURAL ISSUES IN PATIENTS CARE: TRANSCULTURAL NURSING APPROACH” (3 ECTS)

Main aim - to equip students with the knowledge, skills, and attitudes necessary to deliver culturally sensitive and ethically grounded care in diverse healthcare settings. By fostering an understanding of the influence of cultural factors on health beliefs and behaviors, the course prepares students to communicate effectively, apply transcultural nursing theories, address ethical challenges, and collaborate in multicultural teams to ensure holistic and inclusive patient care.

Learning outcomes and competencies:

- Identify and understand the influence of cultural factors on patient health beliefs and behaviors, fostering an environment of respect and empathy in healthcare settings.
- Communicate effectively with patients from diverse cultural backgrounds, employing both verbal and non-verbal strategies to overcome language barriers and enhance patient understanding and comfort.
- Analyze and apply transcultural nursing theories and models to assess healthcare challenges and devise appropriate care strategies that are sensitive to cultural differences.
- Recognize and navigate ethical issues in transcultural nursing, making informed decisions that respect the cultural and ethical contexts of the patients’ care.
- Implement learned concepts in practical scenarios, demonstrating competence in simulated environments and real-world clinical settings to provide culturally appropriate care.
- Work collaboratively in international and multicultural teams, enhancing problem-solving capabilities and professional relationships through effective teamwork and communication.
